aso Robles' small-town charm evokes a gentler, quieter California. With more than 170 wineries, however, El Paso de Robles, or "The Pass of the Oaks," midway between Los Angeles and San Francisco, is also quickly becoming known as the home of the state's fastest-growing wine country, not to mention a mecca for foodies. phisticated shops, inviting wine-tasting rooms, and first-rate restaurants attract many visitors. Although the quaint downtown is easily walkable, pedicabs line the town square on weekend nights-a reminder that Paso Robles hasn't strayed too far from its pastoral roots.


